### **Incident: Armed Carjacking (On-Campus)**

On Monday, January 5, 2015 at approximately 11:26 pm, members of the Howard University Department of Public Safety and the Metropolitan Police Department responded to a call for the report of an Armed Carjacking that occurred inside of the A-2 Garage located adjacent to the Howard University Hospital in the 400 block of V Street NW.

The victim reported the suspect pointed a black handgun at them and demanded the vehicle, which is described as a 2007 4 Door White Mercedes bearing Maryland registration 2AB7363. The suspect is described as a black male, medium height carrying a black handgun. The vehicle was last seen driven by the suspect exiting the garage in an unknown direction. The investigation is being led by the Metropolitan Police Department.

## Off Campus Incident

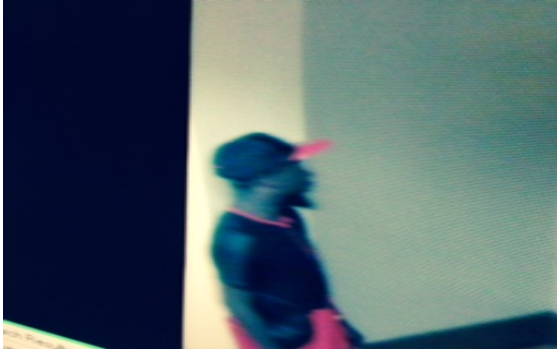
