### CRIME ALERT – Attempted Robbery

Release Date: January 10, 2017

The Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) is currently investigating an attempt robbery incident that occurred in the 300 block of Elm Street NW. The attempted robbery took place at approximately 8:00am. The victim involved is not a Howard University student. The first suspect is described as a black male, age ranging between 11-14, 5'3", wearing a dark jacket, tan pants, and red bandana over his face. The second suspect is described as a black male, age ranging between 11-12, 5'1", wearing a dark jacket, tan pants, with a red and green bandana. The two suspects were last seen heading eastbound on Elm Street NW.

### **On-Campus Incident: Robbery**
