CRIME ALERT – Robbery (Snatch)

The Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) is actively investigating a robbery (snatch) that occurred Friday evening at approximately 11:30 p.m. in the 2100 Block of Georgia Avenue, NW, in front of the McDonald's restaurant.

It was reported that the suspect motioned for a Howard University student to come to him. As the male student approached, the suspect snatched his wallet, took his cash and fled the area southbound on Georgia Avenue. The suspect is described as a Black male, approximately 6 feet tall and 30 years of age, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt. The student was not injured during this incident.

CRIME ALERT – Misdemeanor Sexual Abuse

The Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) is actively investigating a misdemeanor sexual abuse offense that occurred this morning. The Department of Public Safety (DPS) seeks the campus community's assistance in identifying the suspect in connection with the offense.

CRIME ALERT – Burglary One

The Howard University Department of Public Safety (DPS) and the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) are actively investigating a Burglary One offense that occurred this morning on the second floor of the Howard Plaza Towers East residence hall.

At approximately 6:45 a.m., an unknown male suspect entered a female Howard University student's room and took her cell phone. The initial investigation has revealed that the suspect gained access to the room through an unlocked room door. There were no injuries sustained during the incident.

The suspect is described as a Black male, approximately 6 feet tall, 170 pounds, wearing a black hooded jacket and black pants. The investigation is ongoing and it has not yet been confirmed whether or not the suspect is affiliated with Howard University.

However, a short time after the incident was reported DPS officials were able to track the stolen cell phone to the Northeast quadrant of the city where the signal was eventually lost. Exterior camera footage is currently being analyzed for further details of the incident. As a precaution, we urge the campus community to be sure to keep your room door locked, especially at night and when you are asleep.

CRIME ALERT – Assault






The Howard University Department of Public Safety (DPS) is actively conducting an investigation into an assault that occurred this afternoon on two female Howard University students.

At approximately 1:46 p.m., the two students met with a suspect named Jhamell (last name unknown) at the McDonald's restaurant in the 2300 Block of Georgia Avenue, NW, to purchase tickets to Howard University's premier of the new film "Us." During the meeting, the suspect demanded more money than was initially agreed upon to purchase the tickets. When one of the students refused to pay the higher price, the suspect attempted to go into her pockets and take money.

When the two students left the McDonald's restaurant, the suspect proceeded to follow them to Bethune Annex where he went into one of the students' bag while physically assaulting her. The suspect fled in the direction towards the rear of College Hall South. He is described as a Black light-complexioned male, approximately 6 feet tall, with medium-length dreadlocks, and wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and bright colored pants. Based upon information that has been gathered thus far, the suspect is unaffiliated with Howard University.

This morning at approximately 1:14 a.m., it was reported that six (6) gunshots were fired in the 2000 Block of Georgia Avenue, NW, near Georgia and Florida Avenues. Shortly thereafter, it was learned from MPD that the suspect who fired the shots fled in a dark-colored vehicle (make and model unknown) and was last seen traveling northbound on 9th Street, NW.

CRIME ADVISORY – Armed Robbery (Knife)

The Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), working collaboratively with Howard University's Department of Public Safety (DPS), is actively investigating an armed robbery of a student.

This morning at 10 a.m., a male student reported that he was robbed last evening at 8 p.m. The student says he was walking on the 300 Block of Elm Street, NW when two unknown Black male suspects approached him. One of the suspects grabbed the student and demanded his property, while the other suspect brandished a knife. The suspects took the student's cell phone and watch and fled the area towards 4th Street, NW. The first suspect in the robbery is described as a Black male with a bald head, approximately 20-25 years of age, 5'9" tall, weighing about 160 pounds, and wearing a purple shirt. The second suspect is described as a Black male, approximately 20-25 years old, 6'0" tall, about 200 pounds, and wearing a black sweater. Fortunately, no injuries were sustained during the incident.

The Department of Public Safety's Investigative team wants to alert you to recent fraudulent email scams that have affected some members of the campus community. Specifically, scammers are contacting individuals and claiming to have personal information or photographs of the contacted persons.

To prevent the alleged personal information or photographs from being released to the public, the scammers are requesting that people purchase gift cards from big-box stores such as Walmart and Target, and demanding that they forward the gift card numbers in exchange for their privacy not being further compromised.

Please don't fall for these sorts of scams. While DPS cannot prevent this type of illegal activity, we will keep you informed and prepared to help reduce the risk of you becoming a financial victim of a scam. We are also actively working with other law enforcement entities to investigate the fraudulent activity that is impacting college campuses across the country. We will assist in the investigation to the fullest extent of the law.
